## Some key facts about Vernon

- It is home to roughly 25,000 people
- It is in the northeast corner of Sussex County, flanked by Wantage Township, Hardyston Township, and West Milford in neighboring Passaic County
- It shares its northern border with New York state and the popular NY town, Warwick
- More than 40% of Vernon's 70 square miles is preserved open space and the township is criss-crossed by both federal and state parks as well as a 20-mile stretch of the Appalachian Trail
- Communities within the township include Glenwood, Highland Lakes, McAfee, Vernon Valley, Barry Lakes and Lake Wallkill

Vernon thrives as a year-round destination for outdoor enthusiasts. The convergence of skiers and snowboarders during the winter months gives way to hikers, golfers, mountain bikers, kayakers, campers, picnickers in the spring, summer, and fall months.

## Steps To Follow to Open a Business in Vernon

1. New Jersey requires that several steps be taken, and forms completed, BEFORE you begin the process within Vernon. Please consult the New Jersey Tax Guide to Starting a Business in New Jersey as your first step. 2. Vernon-specific information
  - a. The Vernon Township Building Department administers and enforces the regulations of the NJ Uniform Construction Code, NJAC Chapter 23.
  - b. Before performing any Building, Plumbing, or Electrical work, please call and speak with one of the Technical Assistants or Code Officials who can advise on which permits may be required. The office is open on weekdays from 8:30am to 4:00pm. Phone 973-764-4055, x2254.
  - c. Permit costs vary and will be provided upon request from Vernon for permit
  - d. For building department permits, please enroll with the portal to check status of your file, applications, permit costs, and inspection results. The portal can be found here: <https://www.sdlportal.com/>
  - e. The Vernon Township Land Use Board hears two different types of applications—those which are generally in compliance with the township's land development regulations and those which are not. This application is always needed for new construction and for change of use (or if you are referred by another office).

Plumbing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This form should be used for all plumbing work related to a project. Variations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any variations or exceptions from the requirements of any subcode will require this form.
