RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON IN SUPPORT OF AN ADULT-USE CANNABIS RETAILER LICENSE FOR CASTLE OF GREENS

WHEREAS, adult-use cannabis is authorized in the State of New Jersey ("State") pursuant to the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act (the "Act") and N.J.A.C. 17:30 et seq., (collectively, "New Jersey Cannabis Laws"), which legalized the adult use of marijuana by adults 21 years of age or older and established a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for commercial adult-use cannabis operations, use, and possession; and

WHEREAS the State of New Jersey recognizes the need for additional cannabis licenses, both in medical and adult-use programs, both of which are collectively regulated by the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission ("CRC"); and

WHEREAS on September 13, 2021, the Township Council of Vernon Township (the "Township") adopted Ordinance 21-25 (the "Ordinance") which authorized a maximum of three Cannabis Retailers within the Township; and

WHEREAS the Township recognizes that while the ultimate decision to approve new cannabis licensees is guided by the standards identified by the New Jersey Cannabis Laws and vested to the discretion of the CRC; and

WHEREAS the New Jersey Cannabis Laws recognize the necessity of ensuring that any potential licensee/permittee has the support of the local community, as evidenced by a resolution adopted by said municipality's governing body indicating that the intended location is appropriately located or otherwise suitable for activities related to the operations of the proposed cannabis business; and

WHEREAS the New Jersey Cannabis Laws also require, in addition to the resolution identifying support of the local community, a letter from the Township's governing body entrusted with zoning or land use that the proposed cannabis business location will conform to municipal zoning requirements allowing for activities related to the operations of the proposed cannabis business to be conducted at the location, and any variances granted as necessary; and

WHEREAS, Castle of Greens has indicated a desire to operate as a cannabis retailer, as that term is defined by the New Jersey Cannabis Laws, at the property identified as 218 Route 94, Vernon, NJ 07461, Block 385, Lots 12 and 13 on the official tax map of the Township; and

WHEREAS, Castle of Greens has requested proof of local support in accordance with the New Jersey Cannabis Laws and the CRC's Notice of Application Acceptance for Personal Use Cannabis Licenses; and

WHEREAS, issuance of a license to Castle of Greens would not exceed the limitation on licenses set forth in the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council recognize ample benefits to the Township and its residents associated with permitting a cannabis retailer site to be located within its border, including, but not limited to, job creation and use of local vendors for operational needs as well as anticipated dedicated tax revenues; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution may be used by Castle of Greens as proof of local support required by the New Jersey Cannabis Laws and the CRC's Notice of Application Acceptance for Personal Use Cannabis Licenses.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Vernon, in the County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Township Council believes that the Township of Vernon will benefit from the location of an adult-use cannabis retailer within the Township's boundaries, subject to compliance with the Ordinance.
- 2. Cannabis Retailing is a conditional use in all commercial and retail zones within the Township and subject to the limitations set forth in accordance with the Ordinance.
- 3. Castle of Greens has submitted information regarding its business plan, including, but not limited to, its proposed location at the property identified as 218 Route 94, Vernon, NJ 07461, Block 385, Lots 12 and 13 on the official tax map of the Township and its intended use and operation of said property as a cannabis retailer, as that term is defined by New Jersey Cannabis Laws, subject to licensure by the CRC.
- 4. This Resolution should be viewed by the State as support by the Township of Castle of Greens' application, and an indication that the proposed location is appropriately located or otherwise suitable for the activities related to cannabis retailing as will be conducted at the proposed facility.
- 5. - 6. This Resolution may be used by Castle of Greens as proof of local support required by the New Jersey Cannabis Laws and the CRC's Notice of Application Acceptance for Personal Use Cannabis Licenses.
- 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Dear Mr. Voelker,

In examining the contract options for the IT Consultant position for the Township, it has been my proposal for the Township to engage in the Competitive Contract procurement method. We have used this successfully in the past, the procurement at hand is more complicated and requires greater examination than a straight base bid. The danger in a base bid is that we are required to go with the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. Such a bidder could conceivably comply with the requirements, but the service and software are not at an optimum level (e.g., Lotus software versus Microsoft Excel) and our needs are not met.

The position is a consultant position and not a professional service. Therefore, it is inappropriate to use a professional services exemption. The advantage of the competitive contract process is that it will allow for a far more stable contract environment, combined with the ability for end user input, weighting the award upon other factors, in addition to cost, as allowable under law. In the instance of IT Consulting services, the Township can procure a vendor for up to five (5) years as allowable by law at N.J.S.A. 40A:11-4.1.

It is important to note that the contract of up to a five (5) year can allow us great flexibility. The contract may be awarded for a one (1), or two (2) year initial contract and allow for extensions of yearly up until the five (5) year limit has been reached.

The raters have conducted their ratings and have found in favor of Integrated Microsystems Inc. The summary report (attached) has been placed on the bidnet public portal in accord with the New Jersey legal requirement of at least 48 hours public notice prior to award. If there are any questions as to how the competitive contracting process is different from a bid, please let me know. Thank you.

WHEREAS, the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area ("DEWA") was established September 1, 1965, one of 10 National Recreation Areas of the National Park Service, currently encompassing nearly 70,000 acres in New Jersey and Pennsylvania and is a protected area in the United States established by an Act of Congress to preserve enhanced recreational opportunities in places with significant natural and scenic resources; and

WHEREAS, the DEWA offers recreational opportunities such as hiking, walking, bicycling, fishing, hunting, swimming, camping, canoeing, boating, cross country skiing, bird watching, horseback riding, sightseeing, and special events; cultural resources, infrastructural facilities, national resources, and rare, threatened and endangered species of plants, fish, mammals, reptiles and amphibians; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon has several state and federal parks that run through its boundaries or that are in close proximity including but not limited to the Wawayanda State Park, High Point State Park, Wallkill River National Wildlife Refuge, and the DEWA. The Township of Vernon's residents and many visitors enjoy these recreational opportunities as well as cultural and natural resources of this open space and local businesses benefit from the tourism brought to the Township of Vernon; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Vernon is aware of a proposal by the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Chapters of the Sierra Club seeking to change the designation of the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area to the Delaware River National Park and Lenape Preserve; and

WHEREAS, the proposal by the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Chapters of the Sierra Club offers no insight or plan for the change in designation; namely the environmental, economic and agricultural impact to the DEWA and to the residents and local businesses of the Township of Vernon; and

WHEREAS, the proposal by the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Chapters of the Sierra Club offers no information on possible changes to the public lands that run through or abut the Township of Vernon as well as acquisition of private property; and

WHEREAS, the proposal by the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Chapters of the Sierra Club offers no explanation on the location, size and parameters of the "Preserve" area, the activities allowed and disallowed; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Council of the Township of Vernon hereby opposes any change in designation of the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area at this juncture.

ORDINANCE #22-07

CALENDAR YEAR 2022 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK

(N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon in the County of Sussex finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body hereby determines that a 1% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$179,763.05 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the governing body_hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Township of Vernon, in the County of Sussex, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of Vernon shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$629,170.68, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of Vernon be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE #22-08

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK BY THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$655,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$424,047 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of Vernon, in the County of Sussex, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$655,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of \$230,953 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Township for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$655,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$424,047 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the

Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$424,047 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

- Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the acquisition by purchase of new and additional firefighting equipment for the preservation of life and property in the Township, consisting of one (1) pumper truck for use by the Pochuck Valley Fire Department of the Township, including all equipment, appurtenances, accessories and attachments necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.
- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$424,047.
- (c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$655,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of the said \$230,953 down payment for said purpose.
- Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.

- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$424,047, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$65,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations and other items of expense listed in and permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the cost of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, acting chief financial officer or treasurer of the Township (the "Chief Financial Officer") provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the

dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.
