TOWNSHIP COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

May 28, 2009

The Regular Meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Vernon was convened at 6:15 p.m. on Thursday, May 28, 2009 in the Vernon Municipal Center, 21 Church Street, Vernon, New Jersey with Mayor Austin Carew presiding.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

Pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting had been provided to the public and the press on December 30, 2008 and notice of this meeting was posted at the Municipal Building and on the Township's Website.

ROLL CALL OF MEMBERS

Present were Council Members Richard Carson, Gary Grey, Valerie Seufert, and Mayor Austin Carew. Also present were Township Manager Melinda Carlton and Township Attorney Michael Witt.

A Motion was made by Council Member Seufert to change the change the order business presented on the Agenda and to move action on Resolution #09-95 to the public portion of the meeting after coming out of the Executive Session. Motion seconded by Council Member Carson, with all Council Members voting in favor.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:16 p.m. Council Member Seufert made a motion to close the meeting to the public and enter into executive session. Motion seconded by Council Member Carson with all members voting in favor.

The Municipal Clerk read the following resolution to go into executive session:

RESOLUTION TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231, P.L. 1975 permits the exclusion of the public in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Vernon as follows:

- 1. The public shall be excluded from discussion of and action upon the hereinafter specified subject matter.
- 2. The general nature of the subject matters to be discussed is:
 - a. Potential litigation/Attorney-Client matter regarding the Council vacancy. There is no anticipated time of release of the minutes.
 - b. Real Property/Contract matter regarding acquisition of Open Space lands. The anticipated time of release of the Minutes will be at the conclusion of the contract.
- 3. It is anticipated that the above-stated subject matter will be made available upon final decision.
- 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

The Township Council entered into Executive Session at 6:17 p.m.

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The meeting was reopened to the public at 7:29 p.m. Present were Council Members Richard Carson, Gary Grey, Valerie Seufert, and Mayor Austin Carew. Also present were Township Manager Melinda Carlton and Township Attorney Michael Witt.

SALUTE TO THE FLAG

The Mayor led the assemblage in the salute to the flag.

RESOLUTION FOR TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT TO FILL COUNCIL VACANCY

AUTHORIZING A TEMPORARY APPOINTMENT TO FILL VERNON TOWNSHIP COUNCIL VACANCY

WHEREAS, Vernon Township Council Member Glenn McLaughlin was elected to office in the November 6, 2007 General Election, with his 4-year term commencing on January 1, 2008 and ending on December 31, 2011; and

WHEREAS, Council Member McLaughlin resigned his Council position effective May 5, 2009, which resignation constitutes a vacancy of office pursuant to the Municipal Vacancy Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:16-3; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Municipal Vacancy Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:16-5, the Township Council desires to fill the vacancy temporarily until a permanent successor to Councilman McLaughlin is duly elected; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Municipal Vacancy Law, <u>N.J.S.A.</u>40A:16-11, the governing body received the names of three nominees for the selection of a temporary successor to fill the vacancy.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Vernon, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey, that Paul Emilius is hereby temporarily appointed to the position of Township of Vernon Council Member to fill the seat vacated by Glenn McLaughlin, effective immediately upon administration and acceptance of the oath of office.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the temporary appointment of Paul Emilius shall automatically terminate upon the election of a successor pursuant to the Municipal Vacancy Law.

Mayor Carew asked for a motion to nominate one of the three nominees presented to the Township Council from the Vernon Township Republican County Committee to temporarily fill the Council vacancy. The nominees presented were: Mr. Paul Emilius, Mr. Joe DeYoung or Mrs. Bunny Cocula.

Council Member Gary Grey moved to nominate Mr. Paul Emilius to temporarily fill the Council seat. Mayor Austin Carew seconded the motion.

Council Member Richard Carson commented that members of the public have seriously questioned the validity of the selection process concerning filling the Council seat vacated by Council Member Glenn McLaughlin and stated he will not support any nomination presented and will vote no.

A roll call vote was taken.

AYES: Gary Grey, Austin Carew

NAYES: Richard Carson ABSTAIN: Valerie Seufert

Township Attorney Michael Witt clarified that two yes votes, one no vote, and one abstention vote did not have enough affirmative votes to approve the motion to nominate Mr. Paul Emilius. Resolution #09-95 did not pass.

Mayor Austin Carew commented that the public has an obligation to come forward if they feel there was any wrongdoing in the selection process of a nominee to fill the Council vacancy and stated he felt nothing illegal or unethical has been done.

Council Member Gary Grey commented that he voted in favor of the nomination to fill the Council vacancy because the selection of the nominee would otherwise default to the Township Republican County Committee.

Mayor Carew asked if there was other motion to appoint a nominee to fill the Council vacancy. Hearing no other motions, Mayor Carew closed further action on Resolution #09-95.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Carew opened the meeting for Public Comment.

Mary Ellen Vischiconti, Nutley Ave, questioned if the Township is participating in the Click It or Ticket program. Ms. Vischiconti also questioned if the Charter Commission Study is posted on the website. Ms. Vischiconti then asked if the Grant Writer can assist the Lake Wanda Homeowners Association in applying for grant funding for a Dam Restoration project. The Lake Wanda Homeowners Association is not a private organization.

Sam Lewin, Highland Lakes, spoke about the natural beauty of Vernon Township and further commented about some eyesores prominent along Vernon Town Center roadways including abandoned structures, abandoned cars, the malfunctioning detention basin on CR515 and the DPW Recycling Depot. Mr. Lewin distributed photographs of these eyesores and stated that they affect the economics of Vernon Township. Mr. Lewin appealed to the Council to work together to begin to clean up these areas, to allocate additional personnel and to fund resources if necessary.

Eleanor Campbell, Lake Wanda, spoke about 14 Pine Street, Block 159.02 Lot 26, and questioned when the abandoned structure will be taken down. The structure has been abandoned over ten years and has become a neighborhood hazard.

Laura Sidler, Spruce Street, worried not only about the safety issues concerning 14 Pine Street, but also the impact the property has on the property valuations of the neighborhood.

Melinda Carlton, Township Manager, invited Mr. Lou Kneip, Director of Planning and Development to present a brief status report on the 14 Pine Street property. The owner is deceased and there are no apparent heirs. The Tax Collector reported that four liens have been filed against the property. Mr. Kneip reported that in the short term the Township can take certain steps to secure the property to help make it safe. In the long-term, the Township can begin to take steps to raze the building. Mr. Kneip also suggested that Ms. Carlton ask the Chief of Police to increase patrols in the area and for residents to contact the Police when teenagers are sighted at the property.

Phyllis MacPeek, Vernon, commented that the shiny aluminum poles along the roadways in the Town Center are eye sores and are offensive to the beautiful natural surroundings.

Thomas McClachrie, Vernon Taxpayers Association, commented that he brought to the Township's attention six weeks ago the abandoned house on 14 Pine Street and questioned if the Township intends to initiate foreclosure proceedings on the property as a way to address the blighted property. Mr. McClachrie also questioned the detail and cost of streetscaping amenities included in Resolution #09-81.

Gary Martinsen, Vernon Resident and Small Business Owner, read an excerpt from the Star Ledger newspaper stating the tax increase levied in Vernon Township was more than Newton, Hardyston, Franklin and Ogdensburg municipalities combined, and once again urged the Township Council to stop all unnecessary spending. Mr. Martinsen commented on Resolution #09-83 which would approve the purchase of a Community Building at Maple Grange Park and questioned the on-going costs for maintenance and other associated costs that the Township cannot afford. Mr. Martinsen urged the Council to choose local contractors whenever possible to help local businesses. Mr. Martinsen opposed increasing the Economic Development Committee membership and

suggested abolishing the committee since the Chamber of Commerce and Rotary Club could fulfill those roles.

Jesse Paladini, Sunset Ridge, questioned if the New Jersey Local Public Contracts Law allows a vendor to perform work or provide services without an executed contract in place. Ms. Paladini also questioned the Municipal Budget process and why the municipality has two budgets for 2009. Ms. Paladini questioned if property maintenance codes address realtor signs stockpiled at the Weichert Realty Sales office and the Prudential Realty office properties on CR515.

Seeing no one else from the public wishing to speak, Mayor Austin Carew closed the public portion of the meeting.

PRESENTATIONS AND SPECIAL ITEMS

Proclamation for Myasthenia Gravis Awareness Month

Mayor Austin Carew presented a Proclamation proclaiming the Month of June as Myasthenia Gravis Awareness Month.

Sign Ordinance Review Committee Update

Ron Muller, Chairman of the Sign Ordinance Review Committee presented the Committee's proposed revisions to the Township's current Sign Ordinance. Mr. Muller reported the five sub-districts in the Town Center have a defined sign ordinance, which is more restrictive than the rest of the Township, and asked for direction from the Council if they would like a consistent Township-wide approach to signage.

Sign design concepts were presented for multiple-unit buildings and stand-alone buildings, as well as, properties with setbacks versus properties without setbacks. The committee presented suggested signage design concepts with changeable marquis, which they commented would eliminate the need for businesses to use banners to advertise promotions. The Committee, however, stated exceptions should be made for the use of banners and pennants during Grand Opening events.

The Committee commented that this is a very complex process due to the various differences in building locations and configurations.

Mayor Carew opened the meeting for public comment.

Marika Bozzone, Glenwood, requested a copy of materials distributed to the Township Council.

Gary Martinsen, Vernon resident and small business owner, questioned whether the Committee will be contacting those business owners who signed-up to participate in the process and give further input on revising the Township's sign ordinance.

The Township Council thanked the members of the Sign Ordinance Review Committee for their informative presentation and the hard work that has been devoted to this important project. The Township Manager also thanked the members of committee for their diligent work and efforts.

Mayor Austin Carew called for a short recess at 8:45 p.m.

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Mayor Austin Carew reconvened the meeting at 9:05 p.m. with all members present as before.

Austin Carew asked for a motion to change the order business on the Agenda in order to move into the Budget Hearing. Council Member Valerie Seufert made a motion to change the order of the Agenda, seconded by Council Member Carson with all Council Members voting in favor.

PUBLIC HEARING OF 2009 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

Mr. Robert Benecke, Interim Chief Financial Officer, reported the 2009 Municipal Budget was introduced on April 23, 2009 and the budget summary was advertised in the newspaper on May 18, 2009. Mr. Benecke commented the State of New Jersey has not completed its review of the Township's Budget and has not yet forwarded its approval, therefore the Township Council cannot adopt the budget until such time Trenton has affixed its stamped approval and forwarded it to the Township.

Mr. Benecke stated that the Township Council would need to read the 2009 Municipal Budget Resolution by title only in order to properly commence the public hearing.

Council Member Seufert motioned the approval to read the 2009 Municipal Budget Resolution by title only, and commence the public hearing, seconded by Council Member Carson.

A roll call vote was taken:

Mr. Benecke opened the Public Hearing by reporting that the 2009 Municipal Budget increased approximately 3.5%. This increase included costs for all the Township's municipal services including emergency services such as a full-time Police Department, four Fire Departments, two Ambulance Squads, and the Department of Public Works. Mr. Benecke noted that the local School Budget was passed by the voters in April and questioned the continued increase in the School Budget in light of declining student enrollment of approximately 900 students over the last seven years.

Mr. Benecke reported that Township wages and salaries decreased approximately 10%, or \$645,000, from 2008 salaries due to the elimination of 20 positions; however, wages and salaries the Police Benevolent Association (PBA) police employees have increased considerably with the recent Arbitration settlement. Mr. Benecke noted the Township has a substantial balance of monies currently in the Open Space Fund, which can only be used for the acquisition of open space. Mr. Benecke also reported on the amount of funds appropriated for the municipal building renovation, and amount of funding appropriated for other capital improvement projects.

Mr. Benecke reported that last year's tax rate was approximately 50% of true assessed property value. After the revaluation process, the total tax rate decreased from \$4.23 to approximately \$2.41. Mr. Benecke informed the public that an average home in Vernon Township valued at \$200,000 would have a residential tax bill of approximately \$5,500 and reminded the public that the School Budget comprises approximately two-thirds of the average Township tax bill.

The anticipated date of the 2009 Municipal Budget adoption is June 25, 2009.

The Members of the Township Council commented that the Council worked very hard and diligently to keep the 2009 Budget increase as minimal as possible. All municipal departments were instructed to cut their budgets by 10%. The Members of the Township Council commented that it is a difficult process to maintain the same delivery of services the public expects and enjoys while holding down costs.

Mayor Carew opened the 2009 Municipal Budget Public Hearing for public comment.

Tom McClachrie, Vernon Taxpayers Association, questioned the percent increase in the municipal tax levy portion of the 2009 Municipal Budget. Mr. McClachrie also questioned if the School and County budgets have been passed, and if so, why those tax levy numbers have not been included in the introduced 2009 Municipal Budget document. Mr. McClachrie questioned the dollar amount reported for debt service. Mr. McClachrie also commented on the municipal employee salary range increases contained in the 2009 Manager's line item budget document and stated the Township Council should consider a salary freeze or institute furloughs to control salary and wage costs.

Mr. McClachrie urged the Township Council to cut and eliminate all unnecessary spending. He commented that current economic conditions are creating true hardships for many taxpayers and requested the Township Council to identify essential services and cut all other spending in order to avoid a double-digit tax increase next year.

Gary Martinsen, Vernon resident and small business owner, questioned if the Township has included any new hires in the 2009 Budget and questioned if salary increases for non-union employees is included. Mr. Martinsen questioned many expenditures presented in the 2009 Municipal Budget.

Mary Ellen Vischiconti, Nutley Avenue, commented that more and more Vernon residents are using the food bank in Franklin, and the Salvation Army, for assistance and questioned who would want increases in municipal spending during these challenging economic times.

Jesse Paladini, Sunset Ridge, questioned why there were no budget documents, or a Budget summary, made available for the public to review and reference for the 2009 Municipal Budget public hearing. Ms. Paladini also questioned if there have been any municipal employee job title changes and whether desk audits or civil service exams are required for job title changes.

Margaret Scheahan, Vernon, questioned the new tax rate and how it differs from 2008's tax rate. Ms. Scheahan commented that taxpayers have a reasonable expectation to keep services in place and the public has seen wasteful spending, which must be controlled.

Doreen Edwards, Highland Lakes, questioned how much money The Township has saved with shared services and the implementation of the four day work week for Township employees.

Seeing no one else from the public wishing to speak, Mayor Austin Carew closed the public portion of the meeting.

Council Member Valerie Seufert asked that the Budget Summary be made available to the public in the Municipal Building and also that it be posted on the Township's Website.

Council Member Seufert asked Mr. Benecke for clarification on the state's pension deferral program, the amount of interest to be charged to the municipality on the deferred amount, and when the interest needs to be paid. Council Member Seufert asked Mr. Benecke if the Township can set aside funds immediately on an on-going basis to pay back the pension amounts deferred plus interest when payments become due in 2012.

Mayor Carew commented on foreclosure patterns and the impact on tax collection rates and questioned whether the Township will have appropriate levels of revenues available to pay its obligations. Mr. Benecke stated that the Township's tax collection rate remains strong at 96.5% and stated that a spreadsheet will be prepared, which details differences between the 2008 and 2009 tax collection rates.

TOWNSHIP MANAGER'S REPORT

The Township Manager distributed the 2009 Township Goals Implementation Plan to the Council. The three goals identified for 2009 are "Economic Development", "Financial Accountability" and "Strengthening the Foundation." Tasks and objectives were identified for each goal with an anticipated date of completion. The Township Council suggested that a Special Council Meeting be scheduled to further discuss the 2009 Township Goals Implementation Plan in further detail. Meanwhile, the Council agreed to preliminarily review and prioritize tasks prior to the June 11, 2009 Council meeting.

Melinda Carlton reported eight candidates will be interviewed in the next two weeks for the Chief Financial Officer position and informed the Council that Mr. Benecke has given a release date of June 30, 2009.

Ms. Carlton informed the Council fifty-five applications have been received for the Deputy Township Manager position. Resumes will be ranked by the Manager's Review Committee with a target date of hire August 1, 2009.

The Township Manager recommended the hiring of a Tax Collector and Police Sergeant. Ms. Carlton informed the Council the Acting Tax Collector will return to her previous position upon the hiring of a Tax Collector. The Township Manager will be asking the Acting Tax Collector to report on the number of staff required in the Tax Collector's Office to be properly staffed. The Township Council requested a written report justifying the new hires before any further consideration is given to the hiring additional Township personnel. The Township Council also requested that additional information be provided to determine what the impact to the municipal budget would be.

Ms. Carlton reported she and the Mayor met with representatives of Highland Lakes to discuss several issues important to their lake community. Mr. Kneip gave a brief report of the issues discussed. Issues included understanding the impacts of the Highland Council Regional Master Plan; Township zoning property maintenance code enforcement initiatives to address repeat offenders; traffic calming measures to control speeding; and, replacement of the median stanchions and crosswalk at the intersection of Breakneck Road and Highland Lakes.

Ms. Jeanne Jameson, President of the Highlands Lakes Country Club and Community Association, was invited to comment on the issues discussed with the Township Manager and Mayor. Ms. Jameson urged the Township better enforce current zoning and property maintenance laws and suggested adding warning signage for motor vehicles at the intersection of Canistear Road and East Lake Side Drive.

The Township Manager asked Mr. Louis Kneip to present a brief status report on the "To-do" list concerning completion of the Town Center sewer system. Mr. Witt stated a meeting has been scheduled with Mountain Creek to discuss construction of the remaining section of gravity sewer through the Mountain Creek property and to discuss the Mountain Creek Redevelopment Agreement.

The Manager reported the forensic audit is ongoing and proceeding as scheduled.

The Township Manager distributed a status report prepared by the grant writer firm, Bruno Associates. The Township Council inquired if the Lake Wanda community and the Great Gorge Terrace Condominiums water issue could be presented to the grant writer for inclusion of potential grant funding projects.

Ms. Carlton reported the ICMA Citizen Survey will be presented at the June 11th Council meeting.

The Township Manager distributed an article regarding improvements to nighttime visibility of signage and reported the Township's Department of Public Works has upgraded and replaced much traffic signage throughout the Township's local roads to improve nighttime visibility and safety.

The Township Manager distributed a memo prepared by Patricia Seger, Director of Community Affairs, which presents an update on the Sussex County annual maintenance program of the CR515 retention basin.

Ms. Carlton informed the Council and public that the Sussex County Health Department will give a presentation on the Swine Flu at the June 11, 2009 Township Council meeting and a press release will be issued to encourage public attendance.

The Township Manager invited Mr. Frank DeBerry, President and Chief Operations Officer for Mountain Creek Resort, was invited to comment on the status of the Temporary Structure Permits at Mountain Creek and the implementation of a new Business and Management Plan. Mr. DeBerry commented that he anticipates Mountain Creek's new Business and Management Plan to be completed in July 2009 and would be implemented over the next three years. Mr. DeBerry offered to make the

plan available to Township officials once it is completed. Mr. DeBerry asked the Township Council to consider granting additional time to replace the temporary structures and offered to have the structures inspected by "Sprung" technicians.

The Township Manager distributed her office's analysis report on the Four Day Work Week for Council's review.

Mayor Austin Carew called for a short recess at 11:36 p.m.

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Mayor Austin Carew reconvened the meeting at 11:46 p.m. will all members present as before.

AUTHORIZATION TO ENDORSE A TREATMENT WORKS APPROVAL (TWA)
APPLICATION TO THE NJDEP FOR SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS FOR
THE SAMMIS FARM HOTEL AND RECREATION CENTER
BLOCK 231, LOTS 9 & 11, BLOCK 233.05, LOTS 5 & 6

WHEREAS, Sussex National Development, Inc. has the need to apply for a Treatment Works Approval from the NJDEP for sanitary sewer system improvements for the proposed Sammis Farm Hotel and Recreation Center project; and

WHEREAS, the Vernon Township Planning Board has given Preliminary Major Site Plan approval for the construction of a Hotel and Recreation Center on said property; and

WHEREAS, Sussex National Development Inc. has requested that Vernon Township endorse the Treatment Works Approval (TWA) application to be submitted to the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP); and

WHEREAS, Sussex National Development Inc. will pay for the entire cost of the Sanitary Sewer Improvements for the proposed Hotel and Recreation Center; and

WHEREAS, Sussex National Development Inc. has indicated that it will require 15,250 gallons per day (g.p.d.) of sewer allocation for the project; and
