

Dewberry Engineers Inc. (Dewberry) herein presents this scope of work and cost proposal to perform environmental services at the above-referenced site. The subject property is located in the Glenwood section of Vernon Township at the southwest terminus of Silver Spruce Road next to the wooded property. The fill pile is lobed in shape (about 36,000 cubic yards in volume) and is approximately 20 feet in depth at its thickest. The property owner, Mr. Wallace of 3 Silver Springs Road, has been importing fill material onto the property for many years.

This proposal was developed based, in part, on a New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) letter dated December 19, 2022, regarding Vernon Township's Request for Proposal of the Subject Property, and the March 21, 2023 E-mail sent to John Robinson at Dewberry. The NJDEP provided various sampling scenario's during which analytical data would be generated to meet the requirements of transporting approximately 36,000 cubic yards of fill material from the property for disposal/recycling/reuse. The NJDEP letter identified only the Sussex County Landfill as a potential disposal site for the material and provided a sampling program that the Department believes would meet the requirements of the landfill. However, we should note that the Sussex County Landfill sampling protocol/frequency of samples for 36,000 cubic yards does request sampling from 45 equal grids across the pile, not the 8 soil borings referenced in the NJDEP correspondence. Our costs and approach are based oun your request and NJDEP's proposed approach for 8 soil borings.

This proposal includes costs for one sample number/analytical suite scenario (1A) to characterize the material for export to the Sussex County Landfill (SCL). All of the export scenarios (1A, 1B, 1C, 1D) as outlined in the NJDEP correspondence are potential avenues for the removal of the fill from the site and are provided as an attachment to this proposal for reference. At this time, there are no analytical data available from samples collected from the fill that would guide which of the export scenarios would be the most plausible for the Township. Included in this proposal is the sampling cost for option 1A, which in general, is the most expensive sampling option, but is likely the most expeditious disposal option.

However, as provided below for your consideration (see Proposed Approach on page 3), we suggest an alternative sampling scenario that includes the completion of an initial limited sampling event, providing analytical data on the fill material but which does not fully characterize the entire volume of soil. The NJDEP correspondence did account for two likely sampling events, and we believe that initial screening of the soil will provide a clearer picture of where the fill material can be exported, thus allowing for a more

focused, cost-effective, second sampling event that is tailored towards a selected one or two likely destinations for this fill material. This approach is designed to minimize unnecessary sampling and associated laboratory costs.

### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

The scope of work for this project consists of the following tasks:

- Task 1 Site Visit and Inspection
- Task 2 Soil Sampling and Analysis
- Task 3 Data Compilation and Evaluation
- Task 4 Preparation of Soil Characterization Report
- Task 5 Project Management

The proposed tasks are described below.

### Task 1 - Site Visit and Inspection

Experienced Dewberry staff members will visit the site to perform a visual inspection of the area, including identifying fill material type, limits, loose areas, potential access issues, and other pertinent field data related to the unauthorized fill placement on the Subject Property. Potential sampling locations will be identified and staked. A site-specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP) will be prepared for the work scope prior to conducting the site visit or other field activities.

### Task 2 - Soil Sampling and Analysis

A subsurface exploration program will be conducted which will include eight soil borings to 20 feet in depth, or the depth of underlying native material. A Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) consisting of a proposed sampling summary, a figure illustrating the proposed sampling locations, and a sample analysis summary table will be prepared prior to the field investigation. Following Option 1A for waste characterization, our field personnel will collect approximately nine unbiased environmental soil samples (including grain size analysis) for laboratory analysis from each boring (a total of 72 samples), at approximate 2-ft depth intervals. The soil samples will be collected using the direct-push method (i.e. Geoprobe). Prior to mobilizing to the site, the one-call system will be contacted for a subsurface utility mark-out. A Dewberry field geologist/scientist will visually inspect, log, photo document, screen, and collect the soil samples, as well as record observations in a field notebook. The soil samples will also be scanned with a photoionization detector (PID) for the presence of total volatile organic compounds. The sampling activities will be conducted in general conformance with the protocols of the most recent version of the NJDEP Field Sampling Procedures Manual. The soil samples will be analyzed by an NJDEPcertified environmental laboratory. Sampling protocols 1A and 1B outlined by NJDEP Bureau of Solid Waste Compliance and Enforcement (BSWC&E) in correspondence dated December 19, 2022, while comprehensive, assume that the material will be accepted at the Sussex County Landfill. Options 1C and 1D, do not identify specific re-use/recycling facilities that may accept this volume of material. The attached cost proposal includes analytical scenario 1A and lists the analytical parameters for the 72 samples included in this scenario. Costs for the all scenarios (1A, 1B, 1C, 1D) are provided in Attachment 1 should other recycling/ disposal options for the fill be considered, and for comparison purposes.

Option 1A (discussed above) includes the number of samples required for Sussex County Landfill based on the landfill sampling requirements. Scenario 1B includes half the number of samples required by the landfill, but with the submittal of a waste characterization request to NJDEP to provide Sussex County

with the level of comfort, it requires to accept the soil. Scenario 1C estimates the number of samples to be collected without a specific reuse facility in mind and 1D only provides a unit cost for the laboratory analyses. No quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) samples (field blank, trip blanks) will be collected on this project since the sampling is for disposal purposes only. Scenarios 1B, 1C, and 1D would be completed in a manner similar to 1A as described above, but with the appropriate sampling and analytical protocols as outlined in Attachment 1 of the NJDEP letter.

### Task 3 - Data Compilation and Evaluation

Dewberry will review the analytical data from the laboratory and prepare a clear, easily readable summary of the waste characterization analytical results. The results will be evaluated with regard to the analytical requirements for up to 2 receiving facilitities.

### Task 4 - Preparation of Soil Characterization Report

Dewberry will prepare a summary of findings in an environmental letter report to document the field activities and soil sampling results. The letter report will include summary tables, a figure of sampling locations, and recommendations for potential disposal options for the township to consider.

### Task 5 - Project Management

Mr. John Robinson, CPG, PG, GISP, LSRP is responsible for the overall management of this project. Charles Stebbins, CPG, CHMM, LSRP is the Quality Assurance/Quality Control officer. As this site is currently not in the NJDEP Site Remediation Program (SRP), the retention of a Licensed Site Remediation Professional (LSRP) of the record is not required. Should laboratory data from discrete samples indicate that the site qualifies as having an Area of Concern (AOC), the retention of an LSRP would be required. Dewberry is prepared to start work on this project upon receiving Vernon Township's authorization to proceed and, at that time, will finalize the project schedule with the Township Municipal Engineer.

### Approach

The NJDEP correspondence dated December 19, 2022, provides multiple disposal options using broad sampling scenarios, with no specific recommendation regarding which option is best for the township. It is our experience that during waste characterization, decisions regarding disposal/recycling are typically advanced significantly when just a fraction of the final analytical data is available on the material to be removed. Although variable, the types, and concentrations of contaminants in fill generally fall into narrow categories. A few initial samples from the material will likely provide a general idea of the soil quality. In addition, typical fill disposal/recycling projects do not require NJDEP approval, rather an agreement is reached based on negotiations between the source of the soil and receiving entity.

We believe this preliminary sampling approach will serve Vernon well by providing preliminary analytical data on the soil to be exported from the site with a minimal initial investment. This will allow Vernon to more clearly identify potential off-site recycling/disposal facilities for a significantly lower initial cost, providing data to be used to screen potential recycling/disposal facilities that may accept the fill material. We are available to discuss further these options if the Township is interested in pursuing alternative off-site disposal options.

Once these sites are identified, a more complete waste characterization sampling program can be initiated so that these data support acceptance of the material at specific facilities. The preliminary data

from the initial sampling will be utilized for disposal approval. This will allow for a more focused sampling program that meets the facility requirements and that does not include unnecessary analytical parameters or a greater number of samples than what is required to remove the material from the site. As noted in the NJDEP correspondence, two rounds of sampling were contemplated for a full assessment of the material to be transported off-site, which is consistent with this approach.

Attached is a cost proposal for the work described above.

### **ASSUMPTIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS**

- 1. We assume that the ground surface will not be covered in snow during the site visit.
- 2. The Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAP) will consist of a figure of proposed boring locations and a summary table of proposed analyses. The SAP is intended for the soil sampling investigation and not intended for submission to the NJDEP for review.
- 3. Two field days are included for the environmental soil boring advancement activities (8 borings) listed under Task 2. An expanded sampling program with more locations will increase the field time for the driller with Dewberry oversight.
- 4. All borings will be backfilled to grade with the soil cuttings removed from the boreholes and bentonite.
- 5. No quality assurance/quality control (QA/QC) samples (duplicates, field blanks, or trip blanks) will be collected on this project.
- 6. Groundwater sampling is not included in this scope of work.
- 7. This proposal does not include a soil vapor investigation.
- 8. Retention of an LSRP for this site is not included in this scope of work since this site is not in the Site Remediation Program.
- 9. The analyses will be conducted on a standard turnaround time of 10 business days.
- 10. Laboratory methods for these analyses are provided in the accompanying cost estimate.
- 11. This proposal includes project management and administration time, as well as time for coordination and meetings with Vernon Township
- 12. Dewberry's scope of services for this work is as described above. Additional work not part of this scope would be covered under a separate authorization from Vernon Township.
- 13. This investigation will be completed on a time and materials basis.

We performed surveying, engineering, and environmental support services at a site adjacent to the Victory Bridge in Perth Amboy, New Jersey, to evaluate the quality of fill that had been emplaced into the basin. The fill was composed of asphalt millings and other soil material and was emplaced to expand an adjacent

parking area at Block 91, Lot 1.02 in Perth Amboy. The approximate surface dimensions of the fill material were approximately 150 feet by 40 feet. The filled basin is approximately 25 feet deep at its deepest point. The fill evaluation consisted of the installation of three soil borings within the basin at approximate 50– foot intervals using the direct push method with a Geoprobe® equipped with five-foot-long macro core acetate liners. The work was performed using a New Jersey-licensed driller. A Dewberry professional screened and collected environmental soil samples from the soil borings to investigate the chemical quality of the fill material. Two environmental soil samples were collected from each boring for laboratory analysis, biased to the six-inch depth interval exhibiting the highest level of visual/olfactory contamination. The soil samples were analyzed by a New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP)-certified environmental laboratory for full Target Compound List/Target Analyte List (TCL/TAL) parameters plus cyanide.

Dewberry prepared and submitted to NJDOT an environmental report summarizing the findings of the subsurface exploration program. Data gathered from the investigation, including borings logs, summary tables, and environmental testing results, were included in the report. Dewberry concluded that, based on the analytical results, the basin fill was regulated and anticipated to be potentially contaminated but non-hazardous. The soil is likely contaminated historic fill as evidenced by the presence of both polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAH) compounds and several metals including low levels of chromium and beryllium. The analytical results indicated that the material was required to be properly disposed of off-site and that further sampling and analysis for disposal characteristics by the contractor would be required by the specific disposal facility considering accepting the material.





### East Bidwell Avenue/Hudson-Bergen Light Rail Corridor Geotechnical and Environmental Support Environmental Support

JERSEY CITY, NJ

We performed geotechnical engineering, surveying, and and environmental support services at this site located in the Caven Point section of Jersey City next to the NJ TRANSIT Hudson-Bergen Light Rail (HBLR) line Right of Way (ROW). The subject property exists approximately 40 feet above the HBLR rail bed. Since 2018, the site owner has placed fill material on the property and the adjacent Jersey City-owned street area, in order to prepare the property for future development and establish roadway frontage to the east. The uncontrolled placement of fill has created an encroachment onto NJ TRANSIT's ROW and caused potentially unstable slope conditions that could impact HBLR operations. As part of its scope of work, Dewberry conducted a visual inspection of the area, including identifying fill material type, approximate slope angle and limits, loose areas, potential for material to roll down the slope, proximity of toe of slope to rail facilities, and other pertinent field data related to the reported unauthorized fill placement. Dewberry prepared an assessment report to summarize the findings of the property inspection and evaluation. Based on the information gathered, Dewberry recommended testing and analyses to further assess the stability of the slope and potential impacts from the fill placement. In addition, Dewberry performed

a boundary and topographic survey of the project area, which included the subject property itself and the adjacent section of roadway ROW. The results of the survey showed the encroachment of the fill material onto the HBLR ROW.

Based on the findings of the property inspection/evaluation and survey, Dewberry implemented a subsurface exploration program with a New Jersey-licensed driller that included advancing/inspecting two geotechnical soil borings and conducting geotechnical laboratory testing of the fill material. This investigation and testing identified the soil strata and determined the engineering properties of the fill material and underlying native soil, allowing Dewberry to perform modeling and slope stability analyses. Dewberry also screened and collected environmental soil samples from the geotechnical borings to investigate the chemical quality of the fill material. One environmental soil sample for laboratory analysis was collected from each boring (total of two samples), biased to the 6-inch depth interval exhibiting the highest level of visual/olfactory contamination. The soil samples were analyzed by a New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP)-certified environmental laboratory for full Target Compound List/Target Analyte List (TCL/TAL) parameters plus cyanide.

Dewberry prepared and submitted to NJ TRANSIT a geotechnical report summarizing the findings of the subsurface exploration program. Data gathered from the investigation, including borings logs and geotechnical testing results, were included in the report. Dewberry concluded that the existing fill material slope was not stable and presented recommendations to remove the fill and restore the pre-existing topography on and next to the HBLR ROW for safe operations. Dewberry prepared and submitted to NJ TRANSIT a separate summary of findings environmental letter report to document the field screening and environmental soil sampling results, which indicated that the fill material was regulated. Soil analytical data was presented in tables and the results exceeding NJDEP standards were shown on a figure. The letter report included recommendations for contaminated material handling/management and health and safety measures to be taken during fill removal/slope restoration operations.

### ATTACHMENT B STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS

These Standard Terms and Conditions ("STCs") are incorporated by reference into the foregoing agreement or proposal, along with any future modifications or amendments thereto made in accordance with Paragraph 23 below (the "Agreement") between Dewberry ("we" or "us" or "our") and its client ("you" or "your") for the performance of services as defined in our proposal ("Services"). These STCs are fully binding upon you, just as if they were fully set forth in the body of the Agreement, and shall supersede any term or provision elsewhere in the Agreement in conflict with these STCs.

- 1. Period of Offer. Unless we decide, in writing, to extend the period for acceptance by you of our proposal, you have 90 days from our proposal date to accept our proposal. We have the right to withdraw the proposal at any time before you accept. Delivery of a signed proposal—whether original or copy—to us constitutes your acceptance of the proposal, including attachments expressly incorporated into the proposal by reference. The proposal and incorporated attachments shall constitute the entire Agreement between you and us. If you request us to render Services before you deliver a signed proposal to us, and we render Services in accordance with the proposal, you agree that the proposal and these STCs constitute the Agreement between you and us even if you fail to return a signed proposal to us.
- 2. Scope of Services. For the fee set forth in the Agreement, you agree that we shall only be obligated to render the Services expressly described in the Agreement. Our Services shall not be construed as providing legal, accounting, or insurance services. Unless the Agreement expressly requires, in no event do we have any obligation or responsibility for:
  - a. The correctness or completeness of any document which was prepared by another entity.
  - b. The correctness or completeness of any drawing prepared by us, unless it was properly signed and sealed by a registered professional on our behalf.
  - c. Favorable or timely comment or action by any governmental entity on the submission of any construction documents, land use or feasibility studies, appeals, petitions for exceptions or waivers, or other requests or documents of any nature whatsoever.
  - d. Taking into account off-site circumstances other than those clearly visible and actually known to us from on-site work.
  - e. The actual location (or characteristics) of any portion of a utility which is not entirely visible from the surface.
  - f. Site safety or construction quality, means, methods, or sequences.
  - g. The correctness of any geotechnical services performed by others, whether or not performed as our subcontractor.
  - h. The accuracy of earth work estimates and quantity take-offs, or the balance of earthwork cut and fill.
  - i. The accuracy of any opinions of construction cost, financial analyses, economic feasibility projections or schedules for the Project.

Should shop drawing review be incorporated into the Services, we shall pass on the shop drawings with reasonable promptness. Our review of shop drawings will be general, for conformance with the design concept of the Project to which this Agreement relates ("Project") and compliance with the information given in the construction documents, and will not include quantities, detailed dimensions, nor adjustments of dimensions to actual field conditions. Our review shall not be construed as permitting any departure from contract requirements nor as relieving your contractor of the sole and final responsibility for any error in details, dimensions or otherwise that may exist.

- 3. Your Oral Decisions. You, or any of your directors, officers, partners, members, managers, employees or agents having apparent authority from you, may orally: (a) make decisions relating to Services or the Agreement; (b) request a change in the scope of Services under the Agreement; or (c) request us to render additional Services under the Agreement, subject to our right to require you to submit the request in writing before your decision or request shall be considered to have been effectively made. You may, at any time, limit the authority of any or all persons to act orally on your behalf under this Paragraph 3, by giving us seven 7 days advance written notice.
- 4. Proprietary Rights. The drawings, specifications and other documents prepared by us under this Agreement are instruments of our service for use solely for the Project and, unless otherwise provided, we shall be deemed the author of these documents and shall retain all common law, statutory, and other reserved rights, including the copyright and rights to any Dewberry trademarks. Upon payment in full for our Services, you shall be permitted to retain copies, including reproducible copies of our instruments of service for information and reference for the Project. Our instruments of service shall not be used by you or others on other projects for any reason or for completion or modification of this Project by other professionals, unless you enter into a written agreement with us allowing for such use. Submission or distribution of documents to meet official regulatory requirements or for similar purposes in connection with the Project is not to be construed as publication inconsistent with our reserved rights. You shall defend, indemnify and hold us harmless, and release us, from any and all liability, loss, damages, claims and demands for loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury, arising out of any use (including, without limitation, the means or media of transfer, possession, use, or alteration) of our instruments of service by (i) you, if such use is inconsistent with our reserved rights or this Paragraph 4, or (ii) any third party, regardless of the manner of use, if such third party received our instruments of service directly or indirectly from you (including if we or others have transmitted such instruments of service to the third party at your request or direction, for your benefit, or, and without limiting the foregoing, pursuant to a contractual obligation that is directly or indirectly derived (or flowed down) from a contract to which you have privity).
- 5. Fees and Compensation. If you request us to render services not specifically described in the Agreement, or, if we or anyone in our employ, is called upon to be deposed or to testify in a matter in which we are not a named party, that relates to the Project, you agree to compensate us for such services in accordance with the hourly rates as set forth on Attachment A of this Agreement or in any subsequently effective schedule, unless otherwise agreed in writing. If no compensation rate is set forth on Attachment A, or through written agreement between you and us, we shall be compensated for such services at our then current hourly rates. We may unilaterally increase our lump sum or unit billing rates on each anniversary of your acceptance of this Agreement by as much as five percent or the percentage increase in the CPI-W (U.S. Department of Labor Consumer Price Index-Washington), whichever is greater. Hourly rates are subject to periodic revision at our discretion.
- 6. Period of Service. The provisions of this Agreement and the compensation provided for under the Agreement have been established in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the Project. Our obligation to render the Services will extend only for that period which may reasonably be required to complete the Services in an orderly and continuous manner, and we may then, at our sole option, terminate the Agreement.
- 7. Reimbursable Expenses. Unless the Agreement otherwise provides, you shall reimburse us, or our affiliates, for all expenses we incur to render the Services for you under this Agreement, plus fifteen percent. We may submit invoices for reimbursable expenses separately from invoices for Services.

If any invoice is not paid within 30 days of the invoice date, we shall have the right either to suspend the performance of our Services until all invoices more than 30 days past due are fully paid or to terminate the agreement and to initiate proceedings to recover amounts owed by you. Additionally, we shall have the right to withhold from you the possession or use of any drawings or documents prepared by us for you under this or any other agreement with you until all delinquent invoices are paid in full. You shall not offset payments of our invoices by any amounts due or claimed to be due for any reason. If you do not give us written notice disputing an invoice within 20 days of the invoice date, the invoice shall conclusively be deemed correct. All payments made by you should specify the invoice numbers being paid. If we receive payments that do not specify the invoices being paid, you agree that we may apply payments in our sole discretion. Time is of the essence of your payment obligations; and your failure to make full and timely payment shall be deemed a material breach.
- 9. Information from You and Public Sources. You shall furnish us all plans, drawings, surveys, deeds and other documents in your possession, or that come into your possession, which may be related to the Services, and shall inform us in writing about all special criteria or requirements related to the Services (together, "Information"). We may obtain deeds, plats, maps and any other information filed with or published by any governmental or quasi-governmental entity (together, "Public Information"). Unless we are engaged in writing as an additional service to independently verify such, we may rely upon Information and Public Information in rendering Services. We shall not be responsible for errors or omissions or additional costs arising out of our reliance on Information or Public Information. You agree to give prompt notice to us of any development or occurrence that affects the scope or timing of Services, or any defect in the final work submitted by us, or errors or omissions of others as they are discovered. We shall not be responsible for any adverse consequence arising in whole or in part from your failure to provide accurate or timely information, approvals and decisions, as required for the orderly progress of the Services.
- 10. Plan Processing. We may submit plans and related, or other, documents to public agencies for approval. However, it may be necessary, in order to serve your interests and needs, for us to perform special processing, such as attending meetings and conferences with different agencies, hand carrying plans or other documents from agency to agency, and other special services. These special services are not included in the basic fee and shall be performed as additional services on an hourly fee basis in accordance Paragraph 5 above.



- 11. Meetings and Conferences. To the extent the Agreement provides, we will attend meetings and conferences that you, or your representatives, reasonably require. Furthermore, we will meet on an as-needed basis with public agencies that might be involved in the Project. Because we cannot forecast the scope and nature of these meetings and conferences, we will perform meeting and conference services on an hourly fee basis in accordance with our applicable hourly rate schedule.
- 12. Your Claims. You release us from, and waive, all claims of any nature for any and all errors or omissions by us related to our performance under this Agreement, or in the performance of any supplementary services related to this Agreement, unless you have strictly complied with all of the following procedures for asserting a claim, as to which procedures time is of the essence:
  - a. You shall give us written notice within 10 days of the date that you discover, or should, in the exercise of ordinary care, have discovered that you have, or may have, a claim against us. If you fail to give us written notice within such 10 days, then such claim shall forever be barred and extinguished.
  - b. If we accept the claim, we shall have a reasonable time to cure any error or omission and any damage. This shall be your sole remedy, and you must not have caused the error or omission, or any damage resulting from the error or omission, to be cured, if we are ready, willing and able to do so.
  - c. If we reject the claim, we shall give you written notice of our rejection within 30 days of our receipt of your notice of claim. You shall then have 60 days to give us an opinion from a recognized expert in the appropriate discipline, corroborating your claim that we committed an error or omission, and establishing that the error or omission arose from our failure to use the degree of care ordinarily used by professionals in that discipline in the jurisdiction local to the Project. If you fail to give us such an opinion from a recognized expert within 60 days from the date we send you notice of our rejection of the claim, then such claim shall forever be barred and extinguished.
  - d. We shall have 60 days from receipt of your expert's written opinion to reevaluate any claim asserted by you. If we again reject such claim, or if the 60-day period from receipt of the written opinion of your expert elapses without action by us, then you may have recourse to such other remedies as may be provided under this Agreement.
- 13. Hazardous or Toxic Wastes or Substances, Pollution or Contamination. You acknowledge that Services rendered under this Agreement may be affected by hazardous or toxic wastes or substances, or pollution or contamination due to the presence of hazardous or toxic wastes or substances. To induce us to enter into this Agreement, you agree to indemnify, defend and hold us harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damages, claims and demands for loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury, that relate, in any way, to both (a) hazardous or toxic wastes or substances, or pollution or contamination due to the presence of hazardous or toxic wastes or substances, and (b) the performance by us of our obligations under the Agreement, whether or not such performance by us is claimed to have been, or was, or may have been, negligent. Unless otherwise expressly set forth in this Agreement, we shall have no responsibility for searching for, or identifying, any hazardous or toxic wastes or substances, or pollution or contamination due to the presence of hazardous or toxic wastes or substances; but if we discover or suspect the presence of any such wastes, substances, pollution or contamination due to the presence of hazardous or toxic wastes or substances, then we, in our sole discretion, and at any time, may stop work under, or terminate, this Agreement, in which event we will have no further liability to you for performance under this Agreement, and you shall make the payments to us required by Paragraph 14 of the STCs.
- 14. **Termination**. Either party may terminate the Agreement if the other party materially breaches the Agreement and does not cure the breach within 7 days after receiving notice of the breach from the non-breaching party. You shall immediately pay us for our Services rendered and expenses incurred through the termination date, including fees and expenses that we incur as a result of the termination.
- 15. Payment of Other Professionals. If this Agreement includes continuation of services begun by other architects, engineers, planners, surveyors, or other professionals, we may suspend our Services until you make arrangements satisfactory to such other professionals for payment. If satisfactory arrangements have not been made within a time determined by us to be reasonable, then we may in our sole discretion terminate this Agreement.
- 16. Assignment and Third-Party Beneficiaries. Neither party shall assign or transfer any rights, interests or claims arising under this Agreement without the written consent of the other, provided, however, that we are permitted to (i) employ independent consultants, associates, and subcontractors as we may deem necessary to render the Services, (ii) assign our right to receive compensation under this Agreement, and (iii) transfer the Agreement to an affiliate of ours, in our sole discretion, with written notice to you (an affiliate for purposes of this Paragraph 16 is defined as any other business entity that directly or indirectly, through one or more intermediaries, controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with, us). This Agreement does not confer any benefit or right upon any person or entity other than the parties, except that our partners, members, managers, directors, officers, employees, agents and subcontractors shall have and be entitled to the protection afforded us under Paragraphs 9, 12, 13, 16, 20 and 22 of this Agreement.
- 17. Applicable Law and Forum Selection. The Commonwealth of Virginia's laws shall govern this Agreement in all respects, including matters of construction, validity, and performance. Except as provided in Paragraph 18, the parties agree that the courts of Fairfax County, Virginia, and the Federal District Court, Eastern District of Virginia, Alexandria Division, (together, "Courts") shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any controversy, including matters of construction, validity, and performance, arising out of this Agreement. The parties consent to the jurisdiction of the Courts and waive any objection either party might otherwise be entitled to assert regarding jurisdiction. The parties irrevocably waive all right to trial by jury in any action, proceeding, or counterclaim arising out of or related to this Agreement.
- 18. Arbitration of Our Claims for Compensation. Instead of proceeding in court, we, in our sole and absolute discretion, may submit any claim for compensation due us under this Agreement to arbitration in Fairfax County, Virginia in accordance with the Construction Industry Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Association, and judgment upon the arbitration award may be entered in any court having jurisdiction. You agree not to assert any counterclaim or any defense by way of set-off in such arbitration, and that the arbitrator or panel shall have no authority to consider, or to render, an award based upon any such counterclaim or defense by way of set-off. We shall have the right to withdraw our demand for arbitration at any time before the arbitration hearing starts by giving written notice to the arbitrator or panel and you; and upon the giving of such notice by us, the arbitration shall terminate, no award shall be rendered, and we may then pursue our remedies in accordance with Paragraph 17 above.
- 19. Severability. If any part, term, or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal or unenforceable, the validity and enforceability of the remaining parts, terms, and provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected, and each party's rights shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the illegal or unenforceable part, term, or provision.
- 20. Limitations on Liability. In recognition of the relative risks and benefits of the Project to you and us, you agree, that our liability for any loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury of or to you caused in whole or in part by us in the performance of this Agreement or any supplementary services in any way related to this Agreement, shall be limited in the aggregate to the amount of fees that you have paid to us for the Services. The parties intend that the foregoing limitation on liability shall apply to all claims, whether sounding in tort, contract, warranty, or otherwise. You release, waive, and shall not seek contribution from, or indemnification by, us for any claims of any nature made against you by any other person who may suffer any loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury in any manner associated with our services, or any supplementary services in any way related to this Agreement. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary elsewhere in the Agreement, we shall not be liable to you, in any event or for any amount, for delays; or for consequential, special or incidental damages; or for punitive or exemplary damages; or for the cost to add an item or component that we omitted from the instruments of service due to our negligence, to the extent that item or component would have otherwise been necessary, or adds value or betterment, to the Project. Should you find the terms of this Paragraph 20 unacceptable, we are prepared to negotiate a modification in consideration of an equitable surcharge to pay our additional insurance premiums and risk.
- 21. Payment of Attorney's Fees. The losing party shall pay the winning party's reasonable attorney's fees and expenses for the prosecution or defense of any cause of action, claim or demand arising under this Agreement in any court or in arbitration.
- 22. Indemnification. You agree to indemnify, defend and hold us harmless from and against any and all liability, loss, damages, claims and demands for loss, damages, property damages or bodily injury, arising out of acts or omissions by you, or your contractor, subcontractor or other independent company or consultant employed by you to work on the Project, or their respective partners, members, managers, directors, officers, employees, agents or assigns; or arising out of any other operation, no matter by whom committed or omitted, for and on behalf of you, or such contractor, subcontractor or other independent company or consultant, whether or not due in part to errors or omissions by us in the performance of this Agreement, or in the performance of any supplementary service in any way related to this Agreement, provided that you are not required to indemnify and hold us harmless under this Paragraph 22 in the event of our sole negligence.
- 23. Integration Clause. The Agreement represents the entire agreement of the parties. No prior representations, statements, or inducements made by either us, you, or the respective agents of either, that is not contained in the Agreement shall enlarge, modify, alter, or otherwise vary the written terms of the Agreement unless they are made in writing and made a part of the Agreement by attachment, incorporated by reference in the Agreement or signed or initialed on behalf of both parties.
- 24. Notice. Any notices issued to us shall be sent to our project manager with a copy sent via email to Notices@dewberry.com or mailed to 8401 Arlington Blvd, Fairfax VA 220131, Attn: Legal Department.

### TASK 2.0 Soil Characterization

Soil characterization sampling includes in-situ collection and analysis of 72 composite soil samples to obtain approval for the transportation and disposal of approximately 36,000 cubic yards of soil stockpiled at the Site. As part of this event, soil samples will be collected between the depths of 0' and 50' below ground surface using a drill rig and excavator, screened with a photoionization detector (PID), locations marked with a Trimble GPS unit, and field composited samples will be submitted for laboratory analysis.

  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes.
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).

### **ORDINANCE #23-12**

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF A NEW FIRE TRUCK BY THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$845,300 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$320,300 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of Vernon, in the County of Sussex, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$845,300, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of \$350,000 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Township for down payment or for capital improvement purposes and including also \$175,000 from Fire Truck Reserves of the Township.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose, including for the purpose of applicable United States Treasury regulations the reimbursement of expenditures heretofore or hereafter made therefor, and to meet the part of said \$845,300 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment and Fire Truck Reserves, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$320,300 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and

to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$320,300 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the acquisition by purchase of new and additional firefighting equipment for the preservation of life and property in the Township, consisting of one (1) pumper truck for use by the Highland Lakes Fire Company of the Township, including all equipment, appurtenances, accessories and attachments necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$320,300.
- (c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$845,300, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of the said \$350,000 down payment for said purpose and the said \$175,000 from Fire Truck Reserves of the Township.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$320,300, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$60,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations and other items of expense listed in and permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the cost of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, the acting chief financial officer or the treasurer of the Township (the "Chief Financial Officer") provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

### **ORDINANCE #23-13**

# ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING CHAPTER 94 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON REGARDING THE POLICE DIVISION

WHEREAS, on February 4, 2021, P.L. 2021, c. 7, was enacted which requires the Civil Service Commission to exempt from the requirement to take an examination for an entry-level law enforcement position a person who has successfully completed a full Basic Course for Police Officers training at a school approved by the New Jersey Police Training Commission; and

WHEREAS, a municipal police department may hire a person exempt from the requirement to take an examination for an entry-level law enforcement position, upon the adoption of an ordinance or resolution by the governing body authorizing such hiring by the police department and the adoption of a conflict of interest and nepotism policy; and

**WHEREAS**, on September 13, 2021, the Township Council of the Township of Vernon adopted ordinance No. 21-30 to authorize the hiring of entry-level law enforcement officers without an examination; and

WHEREAS, on January 18, 2022, P.L. 2021, c. 406 was passed which amended P.L. 2021, c. 7; and

WHEREAS, a determination has been made that the municipal code concerning the Police Division needs to be amended in light of the passing of P.L. 2021, c. 406.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Township of Vernon, County of Sussex, and State of New Jersey that the Township Code shall be amended as follows:

### **SECTION 1**

Section 94-5 of the Municipal Code of the Township of Vernon is hereby amended as follows:

### § 94-5. Requirements for probationary patrolman; appointment.

C. In accordance with P.L. 2021, c. 7 (N.J.S.A. 11A:4-1.3)—and in the sole discretion of the appointing authority, probationary patrolmen may also be appointed without taking a competitive examination if they have successfully completed a full Basic Course for Police Officers training course at a school approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police Training commission.

### **SECTION 2**

Each section of this ordinance is an independent section, and the holding of any section or part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity of constitutionality of any other sections or parts thereof.

### **SECTION 3**

Strikeouts are deletions. Highlights are added material.

Any ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to their inconsistencies only.

### **SECTION 4**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately as provided by law.
