A total of up to \$50,000 per county or \$20,000 per municipality, subject to the availability of funds, is accessible on a first-come, first-served basis to county/municipal governments in the state of New Jersey who are interested in performing population reduction activities, including chemical treatment activities, against the Spotted Lanternfly. The funding opportunity will be available until November 30, 2024, and all encumbered funds approved under this Grant are to be exhausted by November 30, 2026.

Organizations that May Apply for Funding from NJDA: All County and Municipal governments in New Jersey may apply for funding to provide population reduction activities, including chemical treatments, against populations of this insect on their private and public lands.

For approved Applicants, grant payments will be paid as a reimbursement for actual costs incurred by the county or municipality in providing the treatment services, without profit, which shall include the costs for (a) spray equipment and supplies, (b) materials, and (c) labor, as expended and submitted by the approved Applicant. Only costs incurred for SLF population reduction/treatment services provided during the 2024-2026 treatment seasons are eligible for reimbursement.

Additional requirements for governmental participants under the grant program:

- Counties / Municipalities shall follow appropriate fiscal procurement procedures when purchasing approved treatment materials, equipment, and services if applicable.
- Counties / Municipalities whose applications have been approved shall submit invoices for the allowed treatment expenditures. - 3. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.
- 4. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 6101 et seq.), and U.S. Treasury's implementing regulations at 31 C.F.R. Part 23, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance.
- 5. Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability under programs, activities, and

- (c) GRANTEE shall inform its employees in writing of the rights and remedies provided under this section, in the predominant native language of the workforce.
- 5. Contracting with Small, Minority-owned, Women-owned and Veteran-owned Businesses, and Labor Surplus Area Firms.
 - (a) GRANTEE shall take all necessary affirmative steps to ensure contracting opportunities are provided to small, minority-owned, woman-owned, and veteran-owned businesses, and labor surplus area firms. As used in this contract, the terms "minority-owned business," "women-owned business," and "veteran-owned business" means a business that is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned and controlled by minority group members, women or veterans. For purposes of this definition, "minority group members" are African Americans, Spanishspeaking, Spanish surnamed or Spanish-heritage Americans, Asian-Americans, and Native Americans. GRANTEE may rely on written representations by businesses regarding their status as minority, women and veteran businesses in lieu of an independent investigation.
 - (b) Affirmative steps shall include:

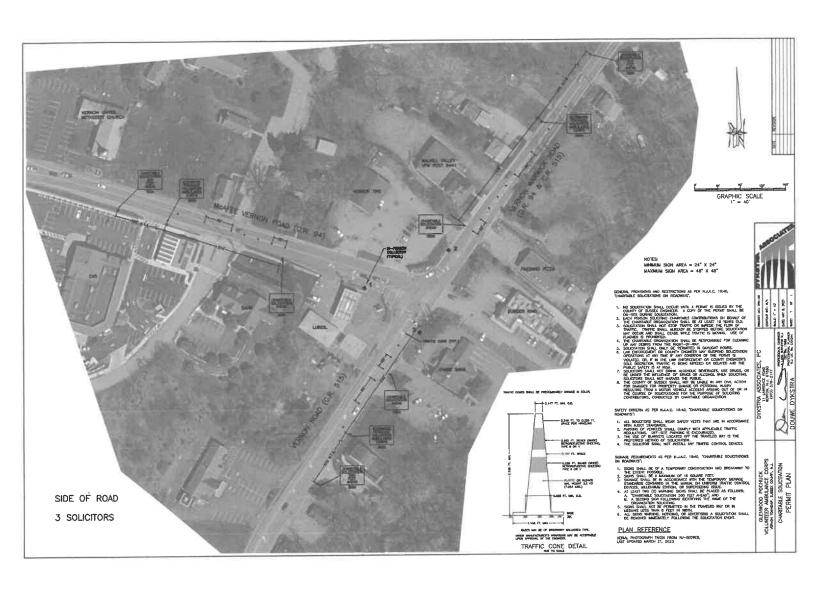

SECTION III. In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior ordinance of the Township, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other ordinances of the Township are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

SECTION IV. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

The requester shall have the opportunity to review and object to this special service charge prior to it being incurred.

ORDINANCE #24-14

ORDINANCE ADDRESSING CONSTRUCTION RECORDS CLEARANCE

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon (Township) seeks to require the issuance of a Construction Records Clearance prior to the sale of any residential structure within the Township, with certain limited exceptions; and

WHEREAS, the Township seeks to establish application requirements, fees, and penalties relating to the Construction Records Clearance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Township of Vernon, County of Sussex, State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Part II, titled "General Legislation," Chapter 205, titled "Construction Codes, Uniform" is hereby amended and supplemented as follows:

- § 205-8 Construction Records Clearance.
- a. CRC Required. No building or structure shall be occupied in whole or in part prior to the issuance of a certificate of construction records clearance (CRC). A CRC shall be required prior to the sale of any residential structure within the Township.
- b. Exceptions. The following transactions are exempt from obtaining a CRC as long as no change in physical occupancy occurs:
 - Transfer of title to correct a previously recorded deed.
 - 2. Title eligible to be recorded as an ancient deed pursuant to N.J.S.A. 46:16-7.
 - 3. Transfer of title between husband and wife, whether or not relating to divorce, or between former spouses if the transfer is incident to an order or judgment from any court of competent jurisdiction.
 - 4. Transfer of title relating to new construction for which a certificate of occupancy is required.
 - 5. Transfer of title by or to an executor, administrator or court order which affects a distribution of a descendant's estate in accordance with the provisions of the descendant's will or the applicable laws governing intestacy.
 - 6. Transfer of title due to refinancing, home equity loans, and second mortgages.
 - 7. Transfer of title by or to a receiver, trustee in bankruptcy or liquidation, or assignee for the benefit of creditors.
 - 8. Residential rentals.
- c. Responsibility. No owner shall permit the sale of a residential premises covered under this section unless the requisite CRC has been issued. No purchaser shall occupy any premises covered under this section until the requisite CRC has been issued. Owners and purchasers shall be jointly

and separately responsible for failure to obtain the requisite CRC required hereunder. The owner or his authorized agent shall submit a written application and payment of fees at least 10 business days prior to the change of ownership on the form provided by the Township.

- d. Preoccupancy records inspection. Prior to the issuance of any such certificate for any transaction, the enforcing agency shall conduct a records inspection to ensure that there are no open construction permits or zoning permits on the subject premises. Should there be open permits on the subject premises, all final inspections and prior approvals shall be obtained, and appropriate Uniform Construction Code certificates or zoning certificates shall be issued prior to the issuance of the CRC.
- e. Fees. The applicant shall submit the following fees with the CRC application.
 - 1. Requests more than 10 calendar days from change of occupancy or closing: \$40.
 - 2. Requests within 10 calendar days from change of occupancy or closing: \$75.
 - 3. Requests within 4 calendar days from change of occupancy or closing: \$125.

f. Violations and Penalties.

- 1. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any provisions of this section shall, upon, conviction, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000.00, imprisonment for a period not exceeding 90 days, and/or a period of community service not exceeding 90 days.
- 2. The issuance of a CRC shall not preclude the imposition of penalties.

SECTION 2. Severability.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found to be invalid for any reason by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be limited in its effect only to the portion of the Ordinance actually adjudged invalid and shall not be deemed to affect the operation of any other portion thereof, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Repealer.

All ordinances and resolutions, and parts of ordinances and resolutions which are inconsistent with provisions of this ordinance shall be, and are hereby, repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with law.

CERTIFICATION

This is to certify that the above Ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading at the Meeting of the Township Council held on July 8, 2024, and the same came up for final passage and was adopted at the Meeting of the Township Council held on August 12, 2024 at which time all persons interested were given an opportunity to be heard. ORDINANCE #24-16

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON, IN THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, PROVIDING FOR THE MUNICIPAL CONSENT OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR VEOLIA WATER NEW JERSEY, INC. TO PROVIDE WATER SERVICE TO CERTAIN PROPERTIES IDENTIFIED ON EXHIBIT A ANNEXED HERETO IN THE TOWNSHIP OF VERNON AND FOR THE LAYING OF PIPES AND THE INSTALLATION OF OTHER UTILITY FACILTIES AS MAY BE NECESSARY.

WHEREAS, the properties identified on Exhibit A annexed hereto on the Township of Vernon Tax Assessment Map (the "Properties") are either vacant or have historically received water service from wells and the Township desires to connect said Properties to the public water supply; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Vernon also is desirous of spurring economic development, redevelopment, and capital investment into the area and the properties included within the requested franchise expansion area; and

WHEREAS, the provision of water services to these Properties is in the best interest of the Township and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Veolia Water New Jersey, Inc., ("Veolia") is a New Jersey Public utility corporation providing water service to certain areas within the State of New Jersey, including within other Properties within the Township of Vernon;

WHEREAS, Veolia desires to secure the consent of the Borough to (i) provide water service to the Properties, and (ii) to lay water pipes beneath such public roads, streets, alleys and places adjacent thereto as it may deem necessary for its corporate purpose to provide water service to the Property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Township of Vernon in the County of Sussex and the State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1.

1. Veolia is hereby given the consent and permission of the Township of Vernon to provide water service to the Properties identified on Exhibit A annexed hereto, and to lay, maintain and relay its water pipes, mains, connections, apparatus and appurtenances beneath such public roads, streets, alleys and places as it may deem necessary in the future for its corporate purposes, subject to such additional approvals or consents the law may require, within the lands and premises hereinafter designated

and under all public roads, streets, alleys, or places abutting same for the purpose of providing water service to:

All those tracts or parcels of lands shown on the Tax Assessment Map of The Township of Vernon as identified on Exhibit A, annexed hereto.

- 2. The consent granted by this Ordinance is made expressly subject to the following conditions:
 - a. In the event that the Township of Vernon shall hereafter lawfully elect to alter or change the grade of any street, alley or other public way within its jurisdiction, Veolia shall upon reasonable notice by the Township, remove, relay or relocate its water mains, service pipes, manholes and other fixtures at its own expense.
 - b. In case of any disturbance of pavement, sidewalk, driveway or other surfacing of any public street, road, highway or other public places cause by Veolia, Veolia shall, at its own costs and expense and in a manner required by the Township Code and as approved by the Township Engineer, replace and restore all paving, sidewalks, driveways and other surfaces of any street, road, highway or other public places disturbed in as good condition as before said work was commenced;
 - c. This consent shall take effect upon the approval of the Board of Public Utilities as required by law.
- **Section 2.** Should any part, portion or provision of his ordinance be held unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any other part thereof.
- **Section 3.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication and final passage according to law.
